

Urban Entomology Lab Manager and Industry Project Coordinator

Position Description: The <u>DeVries Lab</u> in the Department of Entomology at the University of Kentucky is recruiting a Lab Manager and Industry Project Coordinator (full time) to assist in urban entomology research and extension efforts. Defined broadly, urban entomology encompasses a multitude of topics relating to biology, behavior, and management of pests found indoors and around structures. The primary responsibilities of this position include: rearing insects (primarily cockroaches and bed bugs), conducting experiments independently and as part of a team, working in homes with pest-infestations, delivering education materials to the public (homeowners, pest control operators, chemical companies), helping students, ordering supplies, and overseeing day-to-day lab operation.

Qualifications: A bachelor's degree in biology or a closely related field is required, but an advanced degree (MS or PhD) is preferred. Experience working with insects (collecting, rearing, conducting experiments), conducting research, and interacting with the public (especially speaking Spanish) are a plus. The successful applicant will have a passion for improving urban pest management and mitigating health risks associated with urban pests.

Life in Lexington: Lexington is a vibrant city that maintains a collegiate atmosphere. Ranked #34 in the US News and World Report <u>Best Places to Live</u>, Lexington boasts a wide variety of restaurants and shopping, and is close to some wonderful hiking trails (1 hour to the <u>Red River Gorge</u>).
